- Exchange students will meet the admission requirements of the host university in terms of prerequisites for courses.
- Exchange students will be admitted as full time, non-graduating students at the host university.
- The home university will inform the host university previous to the exchange about any disabilities to ensure that relevant support can be put in place.
- The host university will provide an orientation programme for incoming students.
- Exchange students are entitled to the same rights and privileges as students normally enrolled at the host university, except for the right for graduation.
- The host university will comply with all relevant health and safety regulations of the host country for incoming exchange students.

Chalmers offer students with disabilities educational support. The disability could be physical, psychological, neuropsychiatric or dyslexia. The disability must be permanent and students must show a certificate of the disability. The support is planned between the student and the disability coordinator.

#### I SALERNO01

- The academic contact person must evaluate the learning agreement and therefore it should be sent directly to him/her.
- The final version of the learning agreement must be delivered to the International Relations Erasmus Office in November (semester 1) and in March (semester 2).

3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than **5** weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving institution.

The host university will report the transcript of records from each visiting student to the home university using the English language.

#### S GOTEBOR02

Chalmers sends transcripts to both home university and exchange student approximately within 5 weeks after the examinations period.

#### **SALERNO01**

Salerno sends transcripts by e-mail first and then by ordinary post to the partner university no more than 5 weeks from student departure.

4. Termination of the agreement

If one or both parties wish to terminate the agreement a notice period of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to

discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: "Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict."

In the event that notice of termination of the agreement is given, students who have already been selected and accepted for the exchange programme may still participate. Notwithstanding the termination of the agreement, each institution agrees that it will continue to fulfil its responsibilities to Exchange Students already registered at their institution until the completion of their particular exchange
